
بشير نافع

He has published many books in the field of Islamic political thought, including "Public Liberties in the Islamic State", "The Islamic Movement and Change", "Approaches to Secularity and Civil Society". Ghannouchi has regular contributions in different Arab papers and magazines.

Former Secretary General of the Moroccan Justice and Development Party and the current Chairman of its National Council. During his career, he served in a number of posts including; Vice Chairman of the Committee of Foreign Affairs and National Defense at the Assembly, MP, Member of the Maghreb Shura Council.
